Cam Coffin To Speak At The January 11th General Meeting

Our General Meeting guest speaker, Cam Coffin, will present; "Exceptional Fly Fishing In And Around West Yellowstone, Montana". His talk will be on Thursday, January 11th.

Cam was born and raised in West Yellowstone Montana and started fishing when he was 10 with his dad and 4 brothers. He started guiding for Craig Mathews in 1989 and has been at Blue Ribbon Flies ever since. During these past 25 years he has guided 160 days per year all throughout Yellowstone Park and famous Montana rivers such the Madison, Yellowstone, Missouri, Beaverhead, Ruby, Big Hole, Boulder, Stillwater, and Bighorn. In 2014 he became the proud owner of Blue Ribbon Flies, which he purchased from Craig Mathews. Cam currently lives in West Yellowstone, MT with his wife Kristy and two children Sam and Izzy.

Cam will teach you about one of the best places in the world to fly fish. You'll learn about the larger concentrations of blue ribbon trout streams and still waters of the Yellowstone area. Over two thousand miles of water are within a short drive of Cam's Blue Ribbon Flies in West Yellowstone, Montana.

For over 30 years Blue Ribbon Flies has been helping outfit anglers visiting the Yellowstone area with the latest in fly fishing equipment, information on hatches, fly patterns and the world's largest selection of fly tying materials. They have the most friendly, helpful, and experienced staff and guides

I have had the most luck on #14 Pheasant Tail Nymphs with a #18 Zebra midge dropped from the eye of the hook about 8 to 10 inches. White Mega Worms have also been productive, for me. This is a good time to take a beginner and have them experience some success.

Also, be watching for an announcement about the Pond at 51st and Hudson. We will be stocking trout in the pond again this winter. There will be a few days that are for "Kids Only". Feel free to utilize the pond to take the kids for a fun day of fishing.

2017-2018 Conservation Issues

Oklahoma Focus:

Things are fairly quiet as legislature focuses on budget issues.

National Wildlife Federation will join our fight for minimum flow and/or water releases when needed in the Lower Illinois River including educational meetings with legislators in Oklahoma and Washington.

Concerns about huge eastern Oklahoma Water Transfer and sale out of state.

OK TU 420 generally oppose eastern Oklahoma water transfer plans and proposal to sell our water to Texas. Tulsa Senator Rader is teaming with OWRB, Farm Bureau and possibly lobbyists from outside the state to withdraw 18 million acre feet at Webbers falls and upstream. Historically large water transfers cause substantial environmental and water quality issues and may limit growth in a region. As water is shipped out of state, and possibly doubling Tulsa's water rates, it could harms cities long term growth, degrade water quality in Scenic Rivers overall watershed and open the door to future water transfers from the Upper Illinois river and Mountain Fork. By law, no downstream impact of any kind is required for any

Loan & Learn Program Starts in 2018

TU420 has recently received several very generous

high volume water withdrawals instigated by the Oklahoma Water Resources Board. And, once approved, water transfer can never be stopped.

Tulsa Dream Team - National Wildlife Federation OK Chapter, Oklahoma's For Responsible Water Policy, Nature Conservancy, Oklahoma Water Sports Association, OK TU and many others oppose this bad idea.

Congressional letter from Inhofe, Mullin and Langford to Corps of Engineers blocks improved water quality in the Scenic Rivers system from Arkansas pollution. States hands are tied by our own Congressmen.

TU will be following up.

TU National Conservation Focus:

Protect Waters of the United States - protect clean water and ephemeral water sources for trout, salmon, drinking water sources and future generations.

Opposition to proposed foreign owned Pebble mine. The mine threatens all rivers in this historic drainage and the billion dollar annual sustainable salmon harvest in Bristol Bay.

Public lands. Retain and protect public lands at national level. Concern 99% of states do not have funds to manage public lands and will sell off to private extraction and timber interest locking out public fishing, hunting and hiking areas.

Conservation funding. Prompting Congress to retain and enhance Federal, state and local funding for conservation, stream and fisheries improvements.

The trout eggs arrived on Oct. 26th and were rushed out to all 7 participating schools with successful hatches having been recorded in 100% of the tanks. (One school did suffer a power failure in the first days of the hatching process and lost about 80% of their eggs, but the others have hatched and are doing well.)

Around the Christmas break several tank leaders and school instructors will determine how many of the hatched trout will be kept over the Christmas holiday and some will most likely be taken to the Lower Illinois River and released. Tanks with greater numbers than 100 trout have serious water quality issues; this is how the students learn about water quality and what it takes to manage the tanks for the greatest survival. We hate to lose ALL the fish, so some will be released early.

Stay tuned for announcements in the spring when we will be ready to let the rest of the trout go. At that time we will be looking for volunteers to go with the students and enjoy an outing at the Lower Illinois River when we will release the remainder of the fingerlings.

There will be several stockings of trout and 2 additional "KIDS ONLY DAYS" on February 19th and March 17th. The posted limit is 4 trout per day. Releasing fish is OK, if the trout are caught on barbless hooks and then carefully returned to the pond.


Local Tiers, Local Patterns

This past month our TU 420 club was fortunate to host Terry and Roxanne Wilson who gave a very entertaining talk on catching Bluegills in farm ponds on the fly and demonstrated several patterns to the those of us able to arrive early. In addition to their year-round fishing habit, they publish a blog on warmwater fishing, operate an internet flyshop and are the editors for an on-line magazine that covers our area, Southern Trout Ozark, on the web at www.southerntrout.com. This year Terry and Roxanne recieved the Dr. James Henshall Award recognizing their contributions to fishery conservation from Fly Fishers International.

This month's pattern is the Bluegill Bully as tied by Terry. The flies tied that evening were catching fish in and around Tulsa the next week by several of our club members, myself included. This fly fishes nicely on 3-4-5 weight rods with floating lines in still

This Month's Definitions

'A Dictionary For Constant Anglers, Weekend Waders, And Artful Bobbers'

by Henry Beard & Roy McKie

Map: Handy, schematic representation of all the various roads in a given area that you are not currently on.

Natural: Type of organic bait rejected by a finicky fish because it is too large or too small, or because

water, especially around woody cover or overhanging trees.



An important aspect of the Bluegill Bully is the positioning of the weight and rubber legs in the fly so it drops vertically and provides moderate slow sink rate giving a Bluegill time to inspect the fly. The typical bite is as the fly drops or after the first few small strips. My bet is this will also be a killer fly for crappie under willow trees this spring. Roxanne says her favorite color for stained water is definitely purple.

Size 10 Hook, Medium Lead Wire, Ultrathread 140, Medium Chenille and Round Rubber Legs

Terry starts the fly on a size 8-10-12 hook with a base of a thinner thread like Ultrathread 140 to wrap a base on the hook. Colors can be anything, with Yellow, Chartreuse, and Black with a Red Butt being most popular. Terry adds 3 wraps of medium lead wire (0.020) at the base of the hook and 1 or 2 wraps loosely forward, and covers the wire with thread to secure.



A robust body is built with medium chenille, wrapping forward to about 3/4 the length of the hook shank and tied off with a half hitch to hold it in place.

SAVE THESE DATES

Local area river and stream clean-ups will be happening on Dec. 9th and the 16th.

The 89'er Chapter and the Oklahoma Chapter of Trout Unlimited along with the Oklahoma River Warriors will focus efforts on both the Lower Illinois River below Tenkiller Dam and a section of the Arkansas River in Tulsa this December.



On Dec. 9th the 89'er Chapter out of OKC will host the Lower Illinois River clean-up. Participants should arrive at the power plant parking lot below Tenkiller Dam a little before 9am. Trash bags will be provided for everyone and a limited number of trash pickers will be available. Lunch will be prepared by the 89'er's around 11 am at the Watts WMU parking lot. Everyone is encouraged to stay and fish after lunch.



On Dec. 16th the Oklahoma Chapter of Trout Unlimited, along with the Oklahoma River Warriors will gather at the Helmerich Park volleyball courts on Riverside Drive in Tulsa to clean-up a section of the Arkansas River between Joe Creek and the 71st Street Bridge. This is a section of the AR River adopted by the Oklahoma Chapter as part of the City of Tulsa's 'ADOPT A STREAM' program.



Terry uses 2 double strands of round rubber legs, for the legs. He starts with 2 strands stacked on top of each other and held in the same direction as the hook. Terry places 3 very soft wraps around the legs just ahead of the Chenille as a temporary holder. Then with both hands, Terry grabs the legs, pulls them sideways and backwards, and holds them in place on both sides of the fly with a pinch of his thumb and forefinger. With the legs in place, he builds a tight thread base in front of, and slightly over the rubber legs to hold them in place.



Don't be afraid to firmly pull on the legs to reposition them evenly across the front of the fly. Finish the fly with a whip finish and Sally Hansen's Hard-as-Nails.



Author Kelly Brown will be interviewing and documenting local fly tiers on their favorite flies as well as some of the flies he ties in the coming months. If you see him at the next General Meeting, be sure to thank him for putting this project together.

Clean-up is from 9 am to 11 am ... trash bags and pickers will be available.

In both instances everyone is advised to "dress for the weather of the day", wear gloves, boots and please be careful.
