Pat Daly Memorial Scholarship Fund Update



The Late Pat Daly Tirelessly Campaigning for Clean Water

It has been decided that the Pat Daly Memorial Scholarship will be a \$25K endowment to the Oklahoma State University (OSU). The endowment will create a forever annual scholarship.

An agreement has been signed with OSU. and here are some excerpts from the document:

"Recipients of the Scholarship will be selected by the Office of Scholarships and Financial Aid, or its designee.

The fund will be used to support the Pat Daly Memorial Endowed Scholarship.

The recipients must be enrolled as a full-time student at the University. The recipient must be enrolled in the Ferguson College of Agriculture, pursusing a degree in the Department of Natural Resource Ecology with a degree option in Fisheries and Aquatic Ecology. The recipient must be a senior level student with a grade point average of at least 3.0 on a 4.0 scale."

We hope to see the first student winner of our scholarship during the 2024-2025 Academic year.

You can do your share as a Conservationist by promotion of Trout Regulations while visiting the Pond. "The daily limit is three (3) trout.

All trout caught and placed on a stringer or otherwise held in possession cannot be released later (no culling).

All Trout in possession must be kept on a stringer marked with the angler's name and customer ID number. All anglers must have their own stringer."

Rules quoted from Oklahoma Trout Regulations.

Example: If you see two anglers tossing caught trout into a bucket, this is illegal.

Trout In The Classoom TIC RELEASES BEGIN

After going full steam ahead over the last several months Trout In the Classroom begins it's winding down period with trout releases from now and until May. (In fact, when you are reading this, we will have already had the first release by some 50 or so, 5th graders from Kellyville Elementary School.) It all starts with our volunteers getting our trout travel tank to the school a few days before the planned release. Basically, a cooler with a mobile battery powered bubbler mounted to the lid. After removing the fingerlings from the classroom tank, teachers are instructed to float a couple frozen bottles of water in the transfer tank to keep the water cold for the trip to the lower Illinois River. The little mobile tank is loaded into the bus, with the students and they are all off to the Watts WMU where the release takes place.

After checking in and getting your fly you do not have to stay at Watts. All legal access areas of the river are open to the tournament. Tournament scoring begins at 9:00AM and ends at Noon. Please return to Watts for lunch and to turn in your score.

We'll have prizes for the most trout caught and the biggest trout caught. Lunch is provided by TU420 and will be served at 12:30 in the Watts parking lot.

(to report fishing/hunting violations)

Gore response time is approximately 5 minutes.

If cardiac, call for help, start hands only CPR, pushing downward 2 inches on center of chest to the beat of "Staying Alive" by the Bee Gee's. If possible, please note time when CPR is initiated. Landmarks to assist emergency response: The Dam, Lower parking lot, Watts, and MarVal's. Also, let them know which side of the river you're on. Accurate information will allow for quicker response time.

If it is a swift water rescue, call 911, or Gore Police Dept, and they will respond in addition to Sequoyah County team.

If a medical transfer is needed, they will LifeFlight from the baseball field in Gore to either Muskogee or Sallisaw hospital.

Always a good idea to carry baby aspirin and Benadryl in your fishing gear. Also, a first aid kit in your vehicle shows that you think ahead.

Let's help keep our fellow angler's safe.

Search nearly any state in America where clean cold waters flow and you'll find what TU has or is doing. Now, if you get a: Yes, but what about me? You should be prepared with an answer. Here is my simple answer. Think of it this way Joe. (Joe is my fictious numbskull who needs help deciding about the mere \$35 dollars it costs to be a TU member.) I say, "Joe, I have children and they have my
