hatch and then grow into fingerlings under their watchful eyes.

Here is a list of the schools involved this year: Broken Arrow HS, Union HS, Jenks Freshman Academy, Jenks Middle School, Beggs HS, Weleetka HS, Kellyville Elementary, Tulsa Met HS, Mendez International Elementary, Collinsville HS, Mingo Valley Christian Elementary, Bixby HS, Tulsa Boys Home, Keifer HS, Sand Springs HS, Undercroft Montessori 7th grade, Webbers Falls HS and Riverfield Country HS.

At the beginning of each school year each teacher begins to prepare their individual tanks and their students for the arrival of the trout eggs. These eggs come from The Trout Lodge in Washington and are the trout species rainbow/ Kamloops. The eggs are set to arrive on Thursday Oct. 31st and at that time volunteer "tank leaders" will come to my office and patiently wait for FEDEX to arrive with the eggs. We will then divide up 5,000 eggs into equal portions. Once that's done the leaders will scramble to each school where teachers and students anxiously await their arrival.

Typically, within a week to ten days, the eggs hatch and then the challenge of maintaining good water quality in the tank begins.

Sometime, usually at the end of February and through late May, we will host field trips to the Lower Illinois River to release the fingerlings that have survived. (Sometimes many and sometimes none make it.)

WANT TO LEARN TO FLY FISH OR KNOW SOMEONE THAT DOES?

As a part of the Jenks Community Education program members of the Dave Whitlock Chapter of Trout Unlimited will be holding a "Learn to Fly Fish Oklahoma Clinic" on Saturday, October 26th from 9:00am to 2:00pm.

The one-day clinic attempts to answer the many questions and mysteries about the sport of fly fishing as well as the where and how to catch fish using a fly rod. Participants will learn about the equipment, fly fishing terminology, knots, fly tying as well as the basics of casting using a fly rod and reel. All equipment is supplied, however if a participant has their own fly rod, they are encouraged to bring it to learn casting skills with their own fly rod and reel.

Weather is not an issue as the clinic is held indoors at the Jenks High School's Aquatics Center swimming pool on the Jenks Trojan High School campus. The morning session begins at 9:00am in a classroom setting and lasts until noon. After a quick 30-minute break for a sack-lunch or snack the 2nd portion begins with knot tying, fly tying and the "hands one" casting clinic. This portion is held on the water in the swimming pool arena.

Advanced registration is required, and the cost of the clinic is \$30.00. The class is limited to 25 and participants must be 15 years of age or older. Sign up on-line at: or by calling the Jenks Community Education office at 918-298-0340.

September 28th - Hard Luck Fly Fishing Contest

Location: Lower Illinois River - Watts WMU

Time: 8:30 am to 12:00 pm

Entry Fee: \$5.00 per fly

Agenda: Meet at Watts parking lot where flies will be distributed/purchased.

The Hard Luck Fly Tournament will be held on Saturday, September 28th at the Watts Area on the Lower Illinois River. We will meet in the Parking Lot between 8:00am and 8:30am. The Tournament will begin at 9:00am and will end at 12:00 noon. A burger and dog lunch will be provided.

There will be five categories of competition: 1) most fish caught, 2) longest fish caught, 3) shortest fish caught, 4) for the person who provided the fly that caught the longest fish, and 5) best hard luck story. Prizes will be awarded to the winners.

The Rules are as follows:

- 1. All participants will arrive at Watts WMU between 8:00am to 8:30am and will donate at least two flies to the contest. No restrictions apply to the type of flies to be donated.
- 2. Additional flies can be purchased from the remaining flies after all participants have collected their two flies.
- 3. If you have a favorite fly you may want to bring several to contribute. Flies may be commercially purchased, or hand made.
- 4. Anglers will be paired to make a team of two.
- 5. Each participant will purchase at least two flies (at \$5.00 per fly) to use during the tournament. Team members may consult in making their fly selection. Only tournament purchased flies can be used to score fish for the competition.

Please don't hesitate to take a firm grasp of the keyboard and reveal to us your experiences or fishing tips (like how to tie a siamese silver beetle bug).

Gore Police Department: 918-489-5963 or 911

Local Game Wardens – 918-431-2550 or 918-431-2544 (to report fishing/hunting violations)

Gore response time is approximately 5 minutes.

If cardiac, call for help, start hands only CPR, pushing downward 2 inches on center of chest to the beat of "Staying Alive" by the Bee Gee's. If possible, please note time when CPR is initiated. Landmarks to assist emergency response: The Dam, Lower parking lot, Watts, and MarVal's. Also, let them know which side of the river you're on.
